

HOW AGRICULTURAL POLICIES SKEW DOMESTIC PRICES FOR CONSUMERS

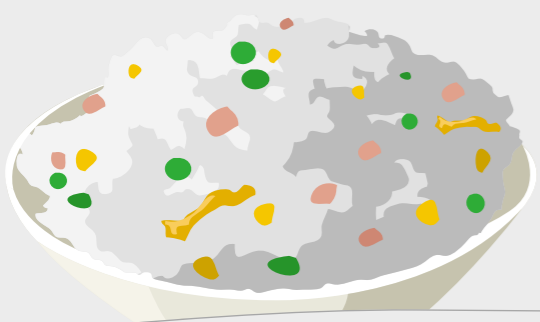
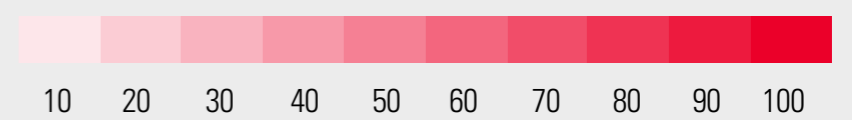
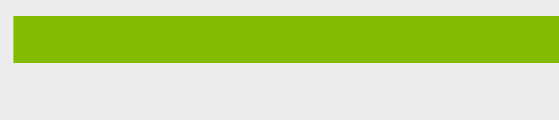
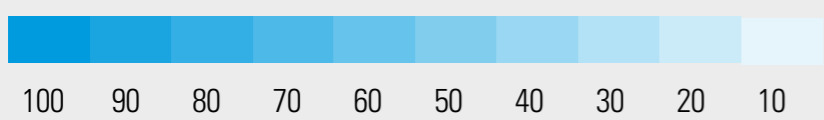
Around the world, government agricultural policies often make the prices paid by consumers much higher or lower than they would be without policy interventions.

Here is a look at the latest available data for the three-year average price of rice in Latin America and the Caribbean compared to international prices (prices not affected by domestic policy).

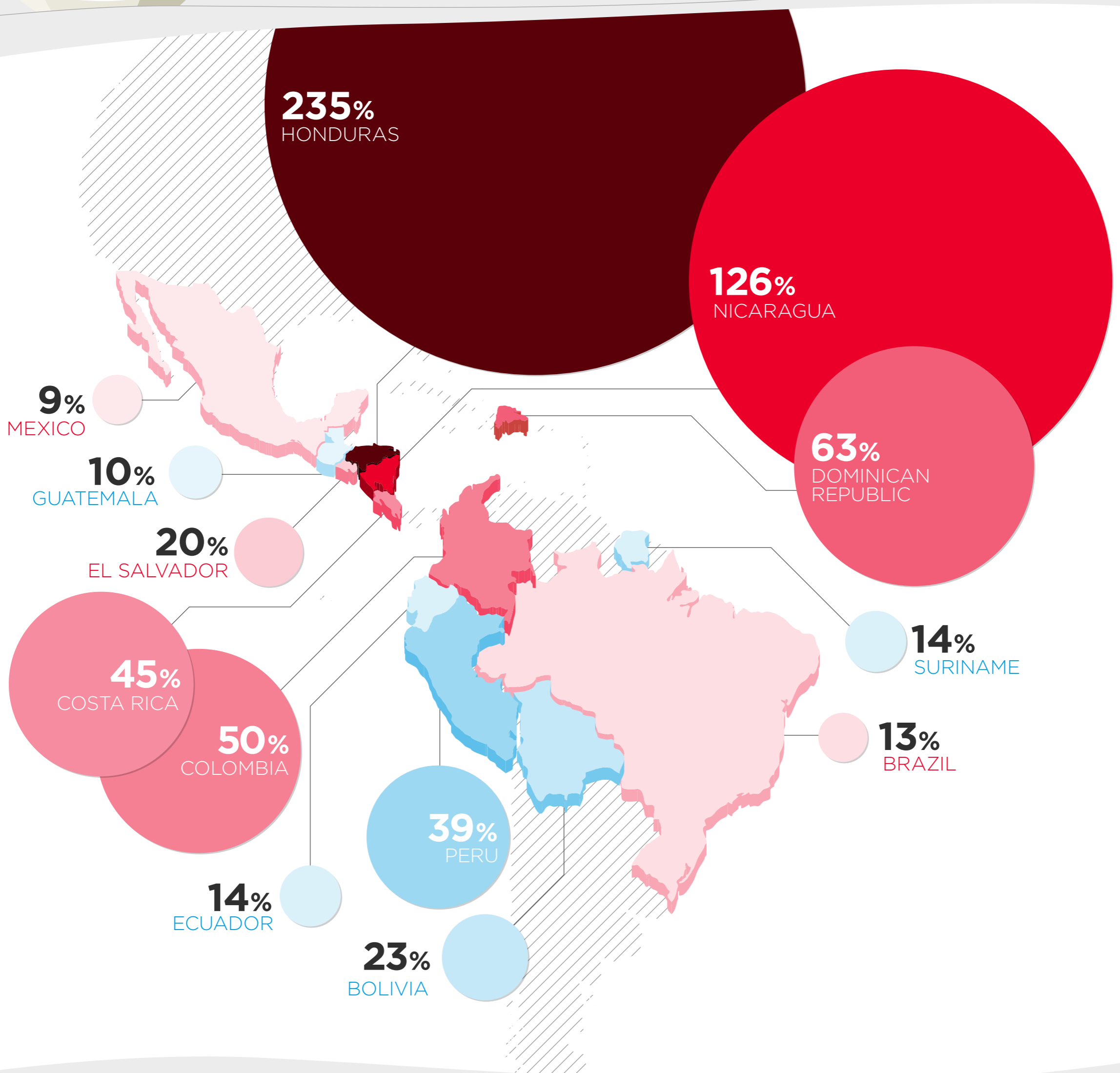
Less than international price
